Last weekend, October 7-8, I participated in the California QSO Party. This event is sponsored by the Northern California Contest Club and is an annual event. I have worked this contest pretty much for as long as I have been a ham.

The requirements are the same amount of contacts for the sweep and the magic number is 58. If you live or transmit from California, the goal is 58 which includes all 50 states and 8 provinces. If you live or transmit outside of California, the goal of 58 is to get all the Counties (58) in the state of California. At the same time you are not only trying to meet your goal, but you are trying to accumulate as many points as possible and each additional state, province or county added to your list of QSL's becomes a multiplier which greatly increases your point total. If you are really interested in seeing what this contest is all about, please refer to the web page by the NCCC in which they have the rules, past contest results and photos from the events. Also take a look at the ARRL web page as it lists all the contests nationwide that other contest clubs sponsor all around the country throughout the year. It is a good opportunity to test your operating skills and increase vour collection of OSL cards from those who participate. It also helps you get used to operating and feeling comfortable speaking on the radio. In a contest, one must be able to make the exchanges quickly, accurately and efficiently in order to

about a change, but we need to get input from the membership, and it is needed soon. final note - on any SoCal mountaintop, expect to share with at least one other club. The use of bandpass filters and contest-grade transceivers will be required.


I wish to conclude with the following survey. Please send your comments / responses by email to: officers@k6ox.club




hope that you would like to serve your club and be a part of making decisions that will impact the future of AVARC.
