#### **President's Corner**

#### **Dan Sherwood W6DAS**

#### Furthering the Art and Science of Radio Communications

As President of AVARC, I have been approached on numerous occasions to facilitate instruction and to provide support in setting up communications programs for various organizations. These include CERT groups, schools, law enforcement, churches, small businesses, healthcare organizations, government organizations, and other groups primarily interested in radio communications especially in the context of disaster preparedness. Most groups want to include amateur radio involvement, however a few may be interested in applicability to other electronic media, (notice I don't say other "radio" services). This is because the request may be to improve someone's grammar and spelling on filling out a form, or perhaps teaching immigrants whose English is a second language, ways to correctly get the spelling straight on proper names in the course of a telephone call. Accuracy is the name of the game in communications, regardless of the media over which it is transmitted.

We, (Adrienne and I), have been approached by groups for the purpose of teaching FCC licensing classes. Perhaps for some, this may be all that is required. For a good many others however, it may be only a partial solution, or even a non-applicable solution. Some groups like CERT may actually use FRS or GMRS, so perhaps instruction on operational concepts like net hierarchy, phonetics, accuracy, and very basic theory of operation may only be in order. We would need careful consultation with the served group as far as identifying the requirements for the instruction. As to basic licensing classes, we no longer have a venue as we did years ago, so we come to those served at their location. Working out a time schedule for instruction is the next challenge. Licensing classes usually require 12 hours of instruction for most people. This may boil down to 4 evenings, with three hours instruction each. This has been the typical model over the years. We've considered "boot camps", but never have done them. This is because boot camps all require prestudy and lots of motivation – qualities that the self-study folks do well.

So, to have a successful relationship with a served group, here are some points:

- 1. Identify the requirements. What do the folks need to learn?
- 2 Are the members of the group motivated to take this on?
- 3. When and where can the instruction be done?
- 4. Three things to get people trained and licensed and up to speed – Motivation, Motivation, and Motivation!
- 5. Can post-licensing instruction be provided? I got a BaoFeng, how do I program it?
- 6. A knowledge on the part of those doing instruction of the group's mission and procedures. Example - Are the instructors CERT trained?
- 7. Will the organization be totally dependent "outside" response by nonmember amateurs on the "bad day"? If so, it is highly recommended some members become licensed, as outsiders may not be able to show up on that "bad day".

8. Will the groups operational plan be in harmony with FCC Part 97 regulations? If not, we cannot be of help.
