RTTY

I enjoy the digital modes, I like the sounds it makes and the challenge in learning these modes. Other than CW I like RTTY the best. RTTY (Radio TeleType) is a little more difficult than FT8, there is a bit more you have to do with it, but once you get if figured out it is a lot of fun.

RTTY (Radio TeleType) uses Baudot code and describes a communications system to two or more electromechanical printers connected by radio. When you listen to RTTY on the radio you can hear the musical dual tones going back and forth and it sounds pretty cool. I found more about RTTY on Wikipedia here; https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Radioteletype.

I use MMTTY software for my RTTY and it was easy to download but there are other RTTY softwartware programs out there. Each radio is going to be different to set up depending on the radio, the soundcard you are using, and your connections.

MMTTY download help here; https://hamsoft.ca/pages/ m m t t y . p h p ? dwn=f435381372f7d3b0

I use my Yaesu FTDX 1200 in my ham shack and also the Yaesu FT 891 for field needed. If you can help or are will- activities and both have their own unique set ups for RTTY. For the FTDX 1200 I use the SCU 17 soundcard, a 6 pin mini din data cable from the back of the radio to the SCU 17 and a usb cable from the SCU 17 to a laptop. On the MMTTY software set up I was instructed to download EXTFSK which is also here; https:// hamsoft.ca/pages/mmtty/extfsk.php

> I use radio command on the MMTTY to use com 3 and on the EXTFSK I use com 4. These cannot be on the same com ports, something I learned along the way. On the EXTFSK the fsk is set for DTR and the PTT is set to RTS. Most of the other settings are on default there is actually very few items I had to change. Each radio will be different so just keep that in mind.

> On the MMTTY software, for the soundcard settings they are basically the same for any other digital operation; speakers on audio codec and microphone also on codec. On the miscellaneous tab it is on COM TXD (FSK) and

the USB port tab is set to normal. On the radio command tab it is on Com 3 for port, 9600 Baud and Char 0. Flow control is checked for Xon/Xoff and CTS. Frequency offset is on LSB and my group is the Yaesu group that included the FT 891. The FTDX 1200 was not listed but it still works for it.

For the FT 891 it is a little different. Same soundcard, it has it's own SCU 17 but I have to use an additional usb cable for some reason. Other than that, everything else is the same.

If you want to listen and maybe even participate in some RTTY Go here to find a RTTY contest. There is usually a weekly one and on July 20 there will be a North American QSO RTTY party.

For our September club meeting we will be doing a demo for FT8 but if folks want to see how the 891 is set up for RTTY we can do that as well. We can see how some of the macros work to make contacts easier. See you then and happy radio to all.
