

nickel, to go tens of thousands of feet in the air and traverse the globe several times. At my tabel I had my CW set up to a dummy load and the scouts practiced sending and recieving to each other. Some came back for a second round and I was so happy to see that some of them were naturals at learning CW.

I was so glad to see the girls there as well, participating in the same events with the boys. I hope to see more girls learning about amateur radio, fox hunting, grid square searches and all the other neat things that were once mostly for the boys. I was very briefly in the Girl Scouts many years ago and I was not into selling cookies or make up tutorials (obviously), I wanted to learn survival stuff, technical demonstrations and all the things I am doing now. I think it is very important that girls as well as boys learn not just survival skills and technical skills, but also how to cook and do their own laundry. To be prepared for anything and to be self reliant, including basic vehicle maintenance like changing oil or a tire. When we don't teach our young basic survival and 'think fast on their feet' skills we are setting them up for failure.

I know that today's youth rely pretty much nearly 100% on their cell phones for communication but I am always happy when JOTA comes around and I see young people at least exploring amateur radio. I am sure the unfortunate folks in the South East experiencing the two back to back hurricanes are well aware of the loss of cell phone capabilities. On that note, before closing, I want to mention the use of HF during our Great Shakeout was limited to emergency comms only, so we stuck stricktly to V/UHF. I wanted to thank everyone that followed that protocol to show respect and support for those efforts over there. Thank you all, and a special shout out to Merle W6MJB on the faarrr West side. I finally got to meet Merle when he came to our table and shared his history and experiences as a radio man in the Navy. What a fascinationg history Merle shared with us, experiences that few can share.

I encourage more experienced hams to volunteer at JOTA events, not only to show support for the Scout Leader but to share technical kowledge and other experiences with these young folks. I feel encouraged and inspired by these Scouts and by other hams that attend.
